On Tuesday, April 13, Trinity Catholic High School became the first high school in the state of Missouri to open its own branch of a credit union when two members of the Trinity student council cut the ribbon at a special ceremony. Gateway Metro Federal Credit Union is the first student-assisted branch to open in a Missouri high school. Gateway Metro Credit Union will offer a variety of financial services to Trinity students as well as assist with financial education programs at the school. The branch will be open at Trinity each Tuesday.

At the annual state finals of the Worldwide Youth in Science and Engineering contest held at Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla on April 13, the Trinity team finished second in state in the medium- size school category. Visitation won state and Trinity was second ahead of Hallsville. Individual winners for Trinity were seniors Alana Schlemmer (3rd in match and 4th in chemistry), Ryan Mircsov (2nd in engineering graphics) and Tim Fries (4th in engineering graphics); juniors Ed Ross (1st in engineering graphics and 2nd in physics) and David Krafft (4th in engineering graphics) and sophomore Connor Walsh (1st in computer science and 2nd in chemistry). Other Trinity team members were seniors Ben Batzer, Garrett Beckham and Matt Juengst; juniors Ellen Hilmes, Amanda Lewandowski, John Ernst, Andrew Holzum, Kyle Perez, Danny Saak and Brett Turnbough and sophomores Rachel Toczyłowski and Rachel Hunt and freshmen Anna Duban and Mike Taylor. This is the 6th time that Trinity has finished second in state. The team is led by Trinity chemistry and physics teacher Frank Cange.
